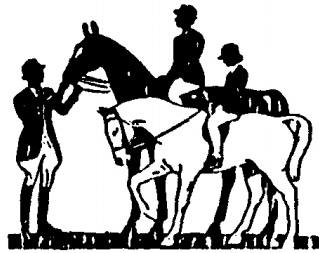

HEMECRAFT RULES.

1. Exhibits can be left at The Pavilion on Wednesday, 15th November **6:00 pm - 8:30 pm** and Thursday 16th November from **8:00 am-9:45 am**.
School entries may be left from 2.30 pm till 8:30pm Wednesday, 15th November only.
2. All Exhibits must be left at the Pavilion by **9:45 am** Thursday, 16th November.
3. Doors to the Pavilion will be closed to the public at 3:00pm Saturday and exhibits should be claimed **after 3:20 pm**. Exhibitor cards must be presented.
4. A separate entry form for each section (i.e. Horse / Stock / Homecrafts) must be used.
5. Every care will be taken of exhibits but no responsibility for them will be incurred by the society.
6. Homecraft prizes will be paid in the Secretary's Office between 2:00 pm and 8:00 pm Friday and 9:00 am and 5:00 pm Saturday.
All persons collecting prize money must sign at time of collection.
School entries and prize money to be collected by the schools on Monday unless prior arrangements are made when exhibits are delivered.
7. Exhibitors will be supplied with class cards and **these must be firmly attached to each exhibit.**
8. Exhibitors are requested to conform to the schedule as regards to number of exhibits in various classes.
9. No first prize will be awarded unless the exhibit is considered worthy by the judge.
10. Most Successful Exhibitor Prizes.
 - a. In each **Senior Section** will be calculated by the following system:
1st prize = 5 points, 2nd prize = 2 point.
 - b. In the **Junior Section** will be calculated on the following system:
1st prize = 3 points, 2nd prize = 2 points and 3rd prize = 1 point.
11. Judges may make class changes (in **Junior Section**) should it be to the benefit of the exhibitors.
12. Classes may be divided at the discretion of the Chief Steward.

HINTS AND TIPS FROM THE JUDGES

Cookery

Check the schedule for size/shape of tin to be used

Line your tins carefully

Cakes shouldn't have cooling rack marks on the bottom

Check schedule for size of slices and biscuits

Scones shouldn't have an excessive amount of flour on the bottom

Anzacs should "snap"

Handcrafts

Watch presentation of articles - they should be clean and in good condition

Threads should be trimmed neatly

Please use safety pins or sticky tape to attach class cards - NOT STRAIGHT PINS

Floral Art

Container should be clean and suit the arrangement.

Oasis should not be visible.

RECIPES FOR COOKING SECTION

FRUIT CAKE

250g butter.

250g light brown sugar.

4 eggs.

60g nuts.

½ teaspoon mixed spice.

60g SR flour.

250g plain flour.

500g mixed fruit.

½ teaspoon salt.

Beat butter and sugar to a cream, add eggs, singly, beating in between. Add flour, spice, salt, nuts and fruit. Bake in a 20cm (approx.) tin in a slow oven for approx. 2 ½ to 3 hrs.

MIXED FRUIT CAKE

250g butter.

250g white sugar.

4 eggs.

6 tablespoon milk.

1 teaspoon lemon essence.

1 teaspoon vanilla.

375g plain flour.

1 teaspoon baking powder.

375g mixed fruit (not cut).

60g chopped almonds.

¼ teaspoon salt.

Cream butter and sugar, add eggs gradually and beat well, add milk, essence and vanilla. Fold in flour, baking powder and salt, alternatively with mixed fruit & nuts. Bake in 20 cm (approx.) square tin in a slow oven for 2 to 2 ½ hours.

CARROT CAKE

2/3 cup vegetable oil.	1 ½ cups wholemeal plain flour.
2 eggs lightly beaten.	1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
½ cup water.	1 teaspoon ground cinnamon.
1 teaspoon vanilla.	1 teaspoon mixed spice.
1 cup firmly packed brown sugar.	1 teaspoon baking powder.
1 cup grated carrot.	½ cup sultanas.

Beat oil, eggs, water & vanilla together. Add sugar, carrot and sultanas. Combine dry ingredients, add to mixture. Bake in a moderate oven approx. 45 min. until cooked. To be cooked in a 20cm x 15cm (approx.) loaf tin. **NOT ICED.**

SULTANA CAKE

250g butter	375g plain flour.
250g castor sugar.	1 teaspoon baking powder.
3 eggs.	¼ teaspoon salt.
2 tablespoon boiling water.	500g sultanas.

Cover sultanas with cold water & bring to boil for 5 minutes. Drain. Cream butter & sugar, add eggs singly, then drained sultanas & boiling water. Lastly fold in sifted dry ingredients. Bake 160 to 170 deg. for 1¾ hrs.

ONE BOWL ORANGE CAKE

114g butter softened.	1 ½ cups S R flour (sifted).
1 cup sugar.	pinch of salt.
2 eggs.	grated rind of 1 orange.
1 cup milk.	

Place all ingredients in a large mixing bowl and beat at medium speed for 4 minutes. Pour mixture into a well-greased loaf tin (approx. 13 X 24cm). To be baked in moderate oven. **DO NOT ICE.**

PLAIN OVEN SCONES

1 egg.	2 cups S.R. flour,
½ cup cream.	½ teaspoon salt.
½ cup milk.	1 dessertspoon sugar

In a bowl sift S R flour, salt, sugar, in a separate bowl mix with a fork; egg, cream and milk, work into dry ingredients. Place on a buttered tray and cook in a hot oven.

SIMPLICITY CHOCOLATE CAKE

3 tablespoons butter.	1 cup SR flour.
1 cup sugar.	2 level tablespoons cocoa.
½ cup milk.	vanilla and salt to taste.
2 eggs.	

Melt butter. Put all other ingredients into a basin. Pour on the melted butter and beat really hard for 3 minutes. Bake in a 20cm round tin in a moderate oven for about 30 min. **DO NOT ICE.**
